NonVisual Desktop Access (NVDA) is a free and open source screen reader for the Microsoft Windows operating system. Providing feedback via synthetic speech and Braille, it enables blind or vision impaired people to access computers running Windows for no more cost than a sighted person. Major features include support for over 20 languages and the ability to run entirely from a USB drive with no installation. (It was written by 2 blind fellows. as seen on The New Inventors.)

Next Cafe Manna is 17th September and we'll be looking at the issue of Disabilities and hearing from a special guest speaker: Louise Gosbell.

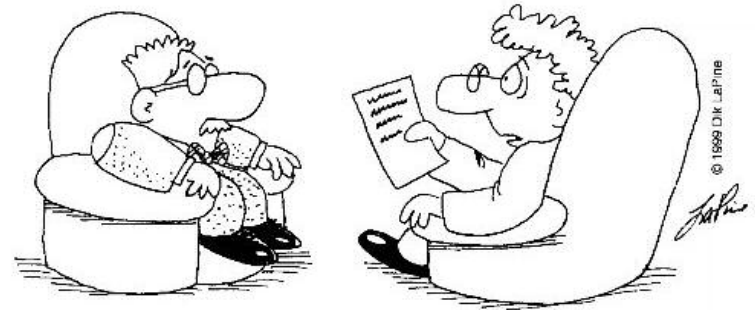
